Who we serve:



The Rapid Rehousing Program serves young people ages 18 through 24 who are experiencing literal homelessness or housing instability.

Referrals for this program come strictly from Coordinated Entry (CE) of the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) of NH and serve the most vulnerable young adults using a Housing First model.

Rapid Rehousing Coordinators are experts at helping these vulnerable young people obtain housing by mediating relationships between young people and landlords in their communities throughout the entirety of their time in the program - up to 24 months.

Our support is confidential, non-judgmental, and free. Our Rapid Rehousing Coordinator meets young people where they are at with what they are ready for!

The Manchester Rapid Rehousing Program serves young people and landlords in Manchester only.

The Seacoast Rapid Rehousing Program serves young people and landlords in Strafford and Rockingham Counties:
