Who we serve:



The Transitional Living Program (TLP) serves young individuals aged 18 through 21 who are at-risk of experiencing, are experiencing housing instability or literal homelessness.

The Transitional Living - Pregnant and Parenting (TLPP) serves young families aged 18 through 21 who are at-risk of experiencing, are experiencing housing instability or literal homelessness. These families can be individuals or couples who are pregnant or parenting at least 50% of the time.

Referrals for this program come from our Transitional Living Program Priority List. Young people are placed on this waitlist by calling our TLP Priority List Coordinator, Melissa Mejia. Any young person throughout the state of New Hampshire can apply for this program.

Availability in this program is not filled on a first come-first served basis. Young people on this priority list will be screened by Waypoint using a vulnerability and screening assessment. TLP also holds certain expectations and requirements for young people such as being employed, obtaining high school diploma or HISET, and engaging in regular case management. The duration of this program is for up to 12 months with an ability to extend up to 18 months.

Young people's willingness and readiness to engage and follow through with these requirements will be factored into their screening assessment determination for an available space in the program. Young people who are not selected for a space will remain on the priority list for the next time there is an opening.

Our support is confidential, non-judgmental, and free. Our TLP staff meet young people where they are at with what they are ready for!
